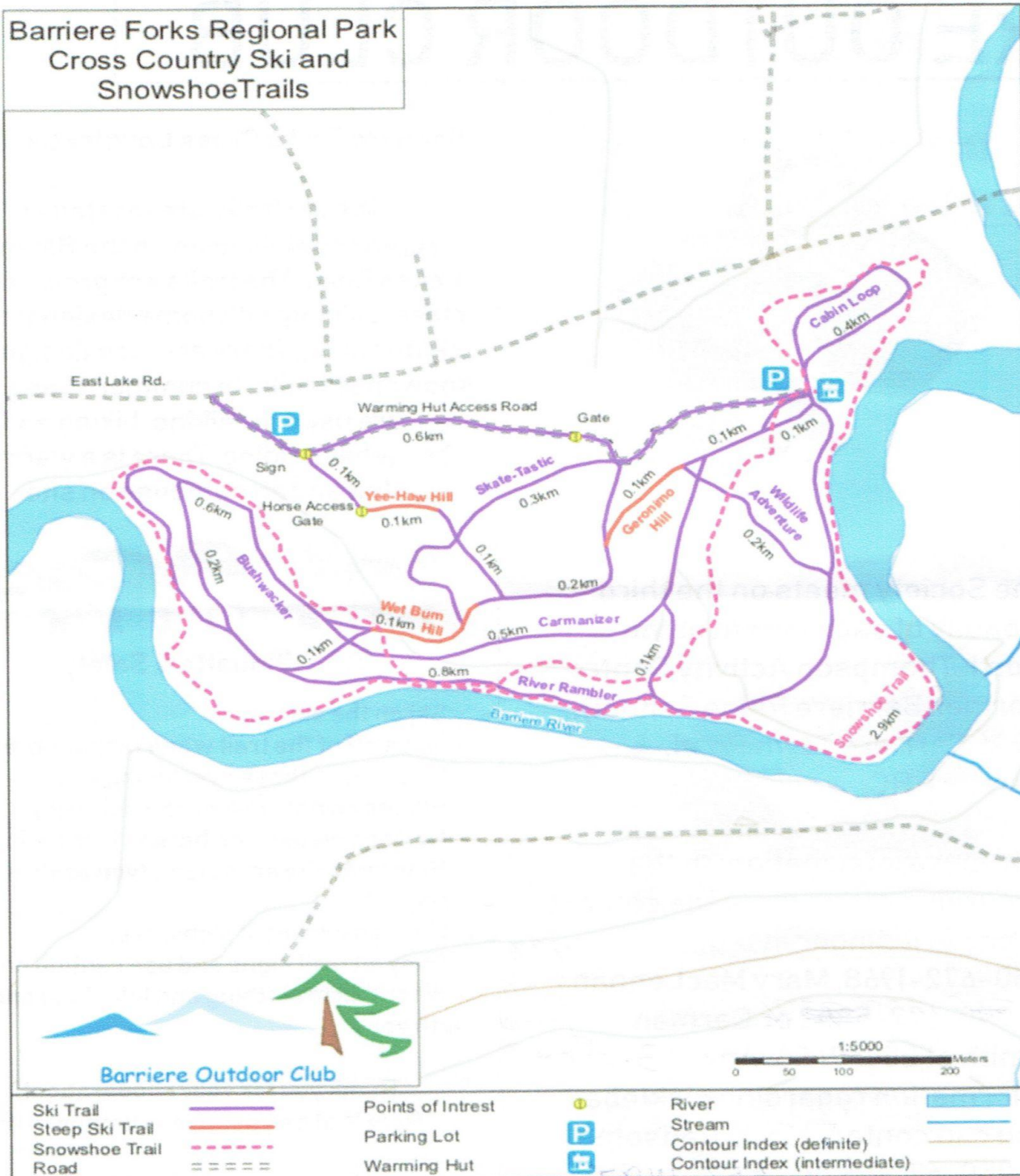

## Barriere Forks Trails

The trails are located at approximately the 16km mark on Barriere Lake Road. In the winter the trails are groomed for classic skiing with some designated for skate skiing. There are also designated snowshoe trails. In the summer, these trails are used for hiking, biking and horseback riding. All trails are well marked and maintained. There is a warming hut, firepit and an outhouse on site.

## Trail Etiquette and Safety

- Ski on the trail tracks
- Move off the trail when taking a break
- Give way to those overtaking you
- Do not walk/snowshoe on the ski trails
- No dogs/horses in the winter
- No fires except in the firepit
- Obey all trail signs and use caution on hills
- Wear warm clothing and have food and water with you
